

Chapter 8 PAGC Members' Responsibilities

- (1.) Shooters will conduct themselves in an orderly manner at all times and will be responsible for the conduct of any guests they bring.
- (2.) All shooters are responsible for their guns and ammunition while on the complex.
- (3.) Firearms that are out of the case and not being fired must be benched or racked (Actions open and facing up, chambers empty, muzzles pointing downrange (or upwards if racked), and safeties on.)
- (4.) Only load firearms on the firing line.
- (5.) Do not point firearms at anything other than authorized targets.
- (6.) Fire at your own target only.
- (7.) Give the command "**Cease firing**" if an unsafe condition exists.
- (6.) Follow all instructions from the RSO and those included in these safety rules and standard operating procedures.
- (7.) Assist in policing the area of brass and any other debris that accumulates on the range. Dispose of them in the containers provided.
- (8.) No pets are allowed on the range complex.
- (9.) Fire only after being issued or possessing an annual PAGC membership card.
- (10.) Notify the RSO or other PAGC officers, or Palo Alto County Conservation Board (PACCB) personnel of any safety infractions or violations.

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

In the event of a medical emergency, **call 911** for emergency services, and notify the RSO or PAGC officers immediately. The address of the property is:

- Take charge of the situation. (Determine seriousness of injury and assigned duties)
- Render aid. First-aid kit should be centrally located.
- Call for help via radio or telephone. Emergency phone numbers and information list should be centrally located. **Call 911** for all emergencies.
- Direct help to location.
- Take notes. Emergency report sheet should be located in range SOPs binder.
